It is easy to live for others, everybody does. I call on you to live for yourself. To be yourself in a world that is constantly trying to make you something else is the greatest accomplishment. Be yourself; no base imitator of another but your best self.

Be not the slave of your own past. Plunge into the sublime seas, dive deep and swim far, so you shall come back with self-respect, with new power, with an advanced experience that shall explain and overlook the old. Happiness is a perfume you cannot pour on others without getting some on yourself.

To laugh often and much; to win the respect of intelligent people and the affection of children; to earn the appreciation of honest critics and to endure the betrayal of false friends. To appreciate beauty; to find the best in others; to leave the world a bit better whether by a healthy child, a garden patch, or a redeemed social condition; to know that even one life has breathed easier because you have lived. *This is to have succeeded!* Without ambition one starts nothing. Without work, one finishes nothing. The prize will not be sent to you. You have to win it. Nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm. A hero is no braver than an ordinary man, but he is brave five minutes longer.

He who is in love is wise and becoming wiser, sees newly every time he looks at the object loved, drawing from it with his eyes and his mind those virtues which it possesses.

Though we travel the world over to find the beautiful, we must carry it with us, or we find it not. Never lose an opportunity of seeing anything beautiful, for beauty is God's handwriting. This is my wish for you: Comfort on difficult days, smiles when sadness intrudes, rainbows to follow the clouds, laughter to kiss your lips, sunsets to warm your heart, hugs when spirits sag, beauty for your eyes to see, <u>friendships to brighten your being</u>, faith so that you can believe, confidence for when you doubt, courage to know yourself, patience to accept the truth, Love to complete your life."
